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Executive Summary



Midaynta Community Services is a Canadian-registered charitable organization with over three decades of experience supporting youth, refugees, immigrants, and marginalized communities across Canada and internationally. Since its establishment in 1993 as a family reunification initiative and its incorporation in 1995, Midaynta has grown into a leading organization recognized for delivering comprehensive programs that address the multifaceted challenges faced by the community

At the core of Midaynta's approach are its flagship programs, each designed to meet the diverse needs of youth and provide holistic support for their personal and professional growth. The Youth Mentorship Program (YMP) offers individualized mentorship, guidance, and skill-building opportunities to help youth overcome systemic barriers and achieve their potential. The Youth Outreach Worker (YOW) and Enhanced Youth Outreach Worker (EYOW) programs provide essential connections to mental health resources, educational opportunities, and employment pathways, while also offering guidance and support for youth navigating complex social and systemic challenges.

The Student and Family Advocate program strengthens academic success and family engagement, helping young people balance educational responsibilities with personal development. Additionally, Project TurnAround provides intervention, mediation, and personalized action plans for youth at risk of involvement with the criminal justice system, ensuring that participants have access to resources and strategies to redirect their paths toward positive outcomes.

Building upon this strong foundation, Midaynta is proud to host the 7th Annual Youth Resiliency Conference in Mogadishu, Somalia, on December 20-21, 2025, under the theme "Beyond Borders: Youth Shaping Resilient & Peaceful Futures." This milestone event marks the first edition of the conference to be held in Somalia, bringing together Somali youth, community leaders, diaspora members, policymakers, educators, and international partners.

The 2025 conference builds on the legacy of six prior editions held in Canada and Uganda, which successfully created spaces for youth voices, encouraged intergenerational dialogue, and promoted youth-led recommendations that informed policies and programs. By convening stakeholders from Somalia and the diaspora, the conference will foster collaboration, knowledge exchange, and innovative approaches to youth development. Beyond the immediate outcomes of the event, Midaynta's programming ensures that the lessons, connections, and strategies generated during the conference will continue to influence long-term youth initiatives, creating sustainable pathways for empowerment and social change.

Through the 7th Annual Youth Resiliency Conference, Midaynta Community Services reaffirms its commitment to nurturing inclusive, empowered, and resilient generations. By integrating its core programs into the conference framework and engaging youth in practical, skills-based, and reflective activities, Midaynta aims to inspire participants to lead with confidence, overcome personal and societal challenges, and contribute to the sustainable growth and development of their communities.

Conference Overview

The **7th Annual Youth Resiliency Conference** marks the first edition held in Somalia and builds on the success of six previous events in Canada and Uganda. Bringing together Somali youth, community leaders, diaspora members, educators, policymakers, and international partners, the conference provides a vibrant platform for dialogue, collaboration, and action on youth leadership, resilience, and empowerment. Participants will share experiences, explore challenges, and engage in practical programs that strengthen leadership, civic engagement, personal resilience, mental health, social inclusion, and address immigration and identity issues.

Objectives:

The conference aims to:

- Empower youth with leadership, resilience, and coping skills.
- Amplify youth voices and generate actionable recommendations.
- Foster networking and collaboration with diaspora and international partners.
- Promote intergenerational dialogue, mentorship, and knowledge exchange.
- Showcase innovative approaches to youth development, social entrepreneurship, and civic engagement.
- Explore pathways for integration, identity, and immigration-related challenges for Somali youth.

Key Themes:

1. **Diaspora and Digital Peacebuilding** – Connecting global Somali communities with local youth through technology and social media to strengthen inclusion, civic participation, and youth-led initiatives.
2. **Trauma Healing and Mental Health** – Addressing psychological well-being, coping strategies, and resilience-building among youth.

3. Youth Leadership and Employment – Skills development, entrepreneurship, civic engagement, and employment pathways to empower youth.

4. Women’s Leadership in Peace Processes – Amplifying women’s voices as mentors and peacebuilders, supporting intergenerational learning and resilience.

5. Immigration & Identity – Exploring challenges and opportunities related to migration, identity formation, and youth integration in Somali and diaspora contexts.

Structure & Sessions:

- Plenary Sessions with youth leaders, experts, and policymakers.
- Panel Discussions on mental health, education, civic engagement, leadership, and immigration.
- Workshops & Skills-Building Programs on leadership, project design, social entrepreneurship, and resilience.
- Mentorship & Networking with community, diaspora, and women leaders.
- Youth-Led Action Planning to develop actionable recommendations addressing leadership, inclusion, mental health, and migration.

Expected Outcomes:

- Enhanced leadership, civic engagement, resilience, and coping skills among youth participants.
- Youth-led recommendations to inform Somali and diaspora youth programs.
- Strengthened networks between Somali youth, community organizations, diaspora partners, and international stakeholders.
- Increased awareness of youth challenges, including mental health and immigration issues, among policymakers, educators, and community leaders.
- Promotion of sustainable pathways for youth empowerment, identity development, and long-term social impact.

Background and Rationale

Somalia stands at a pivotal moment where youth empowerment and resilience are key to shaping a brighter future. Despite decades of challenges, a new generation of Somali youth is emerging with determination, creativity, and the drive to contribute positively to their communities. Recognizing this potential, Midaynta Community Services, a Toronto-based Somali-led nonprofit, has played a leadership role since 2021 in connecting Somali youth, local communities, and the diaspora to enhance opportunities, skills, and social engagement.

Through previous Youth Resiliency Conferences—including five editions in Canada and one internationally in Uganda—Midaynta has addressed critical issues such as youth unemployment, mental health, social identity, and leadership development. These conferences have empowered youth, fostered civic engagement, and strengthened networks among Somali communities locally and globally.

In 2025, Midaynta will host the 7th Youth Resiliency Conference in Mogadishu, Somalia, creating a platform that brings together Somali youth, educators, policymakers, diaspora members, and community leaders. The conference will focus on building leadership skills, resilience, and practical strategies for personal and community development, equipping youth to navigate social and economic challenges and contribute meaningfully to Somali society.

The initiative highlights the importance of investing in Somali youth as agents of change and resilience. By equipping young people with leadership skills, practical knowledge, and opportunities for engagement, the 7th Youth Resiliency Conference aims to create sustainable pathways for personal growth, innovation, and community impact. This gathering will empower youth to navigate social, economic, and educational challenges while fostering networks, collaboration, and long-term development that strengthen Somali society locally and globally.

Alignment with Mission and Vision:

Midaynta's mission is to mobilize and engage Somali communities—both in the diaspora and locally—to reduce barriers, foster resilience, and promote inclusive development. Its vision is a thriving, empowered, and resilient Somali society where youth have access to opportunities and can actively shape their communities. Relevance of the Current Issue:







- Formulate research, development, and education programs and projects to address 'Youth Radicalization'




Recommendation

Create a mental health and addiction outreach program to build capacity, raise awareness, address stigma and encourage access to treatment and services among Somali Canadians.

Outcome

Youth for Change is a new program aimed to help Black youths dealing with substance use and mental health challenges.

Designed for youths ages 15 to 29 who are experiencing substance use or have experienced a problem with substance use.



- The program aims to motivate youth to: Evaluate their life skills
- Develop new coping skills to make healthier choices
- Understand the resources available to them in the community



Recommendation


Implementation of a comprehensive community healing strategy that will provide counseling and support to victims of violence, their families and community members as well as provide antiviolence resolution services and other interventions.

Outcome

Mending a Crack in the Sky is threephase community healing initiative that was developed to address youth violence in the greater Toronto area.

This dynamic program consists of a dedicated group of mothers who are passionate about creating safe spaces to heal and engaging in transformative community change and activism. The core group comprises Somali mothers who have lost their loved ones due to violence in the community.






Recommendation



Outcome

Project Real Talks is a youthled research initiative which sought to explore solutions to addressing gun violence and improving community safety. The project name derives from youth slang which refers to an honest or intimate conversation between friends. Fourteen young people of African descent ages 15-29 were employed by Midaynta Community Services for an 8week summer job initiative to conduct this project. These student workers, some from neighborhoods affected by community violence, were led by a Master's level graduate student.




4th Youth Resiliency Conference

Call to Action: Collaborative Approaches to Build Youth Resilience and Prevent Radicalization to Violence

On February 18th & 19th 2020, Midaynta Community Services held the 4th Annual Conference on Youth Resilience, building on the 2019 Conference's Calls to Action. Focusing on four themes, the focus of this panel was the media's complex interactions with domestic and international terrorism, its critical role in advocacy and awareness, and the need for resources to continue to support trained journalists working on the ground.

Outcome

The Student and Family Advocate program provide Black student/family advocacy and system navigation support to empower them with the knowledge and skills to navigate and advocate for their rights within the Ontario school system. The SFA Coordinator collaborates with students, parents, school administration, and community partners to help increase the academic and social achievements of Black students.



5th Youth Resiliency Conference

2023

Empowering Youth in Civic Spaces

Our objectives for the conference were to:

- To increase awareness of the link between mental health and youth radicalization by achieving a strong connection between young people worldwide as well as creating safe spaces and lifting young voices through resilience education.
- To create tangible solutions for youth radicalization nationally and internationally through knowledge translation
- To mobilize diverse actors to counter violent extremist narratives on the Internet and on social media



Recommendation

The panelists unanimously highlighted the critical need for greater representation of youth in civic spaces. Addressing various barriers, including social, financial, and displacement obstacles, to ensure inclusivity. Stressed the importance of active listening and collaboration to empower marginalized youth. Creating safe spaces for youth, particularly considering global pandemics, to combat isolation and safeguard mental health. Proactive measures from parents and communities, emphasizing tangible actions and awareness of resources to address issues like cyberbullying.

Outcome

These recommendations led to the creation of the Youth in Community Services Program. This initiative equips minority and racialized youth with the tools to strengthen their skills, contribute meaningfully to their communities, and participate in civic engagement. Through the training period, the students will have the opportunity to learn from different expert and community leaders' topics ranging from building leadership skills to working with communities of different backgrounds and cultural sensitivity.





6th Youth Resiliency Conference

Unlocking Opportunities: Finding Pathways to Success

In the year 2024, the purpose of the 6th Annual Conference in Uganda was to build civil society's capacity to respond to violent extremism. This conference brought together multiple concerned stakeholders to address youth radicalization. The conference's major themes were the challenges of settlement, resettlement, and integration; creating employment opportunities for youth; mental health; and family connection.



Recommendation

The 6th Youth Resilience Conference built on past efforts to deepen support for African youth by focusing on mental health, economic empowerment, and leadership. It emphasized the need to strengthen family and community systems to prevent radicalization. Youth inclusion in decisionmaking and access to vocational training were key themes. Regional and continental youth platforms were encouraged to foster collaboration and resilience.

Outcome

Midaynta's Youth Mentorship Coordinator has expanded the Rites of Passage Program internationally by recruiting culturally grounded Mentors who understand the complex barriers faced by vulnerable youth. The program reconnects youth with their history and identity, using oral traditions to guide future growth. By facilitating knowledge exchange across countries, it fosters global responsibility, community leadership, and strong connections within the Somali diaspora. Mentors are selected based on cultural and language needs, offering support that helps at-risk youth grow and thrive.

Themes and Structure

The conference will be structured around four interrelated themes:

- 1. Diaspora and Digital Peacebuilding –**
Fostering connections between global Somali communities and local youth through technology and social media to counter extremism and promote positive narratives.
- 2. Trauma Healing and Mental Health –**
Addressing the psychological roots of vulnerability to extremism by promoting trauma-informed care, reducing stigma, and creating safe spaces.
- 3. Youth Leadership and Employment –** Skills development, entrepreneurship, and civic engagement to reduce marginalization and build purpose, agency, and belonging.
- 4. Women’s Leadership in Peace Processes –**
Amplifying women’s voices as critical peacebuilders.
- 5. Immigration & Identity –** Exploring challenges and opportunities related to migration, identity formation, and integration for Somali youth in Somalia and the diaspora.

Conference Details

- **Dates:** December 20–21, 2025
- **Venue:** Mogadishu, Somalia
- **Format:** Hybrid, with in-person participation in Somalia and online participation facilitated via Zoom to include diaspora and international partners.

Partnership & Stakeholders

Partnership and Stakeholder Engagement Collaboration is central to the success of the conference.

Collaborating Organizations: International Organization for Migration (IOM), diaspora associations, Somali universities, and civil society networks.

Role of Sponsors: Private banks such as IBS Bank, Salaam Bank, and Premier Bank will provide sponsorship and financial support.

Government and Institutions: Somali federal and regional governments have endorsed the event and will participate as strategic partners, ensuring alignment with national development priorities.

Informing Programs & Policy: Insights from these roundtables guide Midaynta's programming and contribute to broader policy discussions. Partners offer perspectives from local, national, and international contexts, ensuring that initiatives remain grounded in community realities while aligned with global priorities. This multisector collaborative approach strengthens understanding, builds crosssector relationships, and drives coordinated action.

Collaborative Roundtables: For years, Midaynta Community Services has hosted monthly roundtable meetings connecting partners across government, academia, international organizations, civil society, and law enforcement.

These gatherings provide a space for dialogue, strategy, and collective problemsolving, shaping responses to issues affecting Black, immigrant, and refugee communities in Canada.

Conference Planning & Partner

Contributions: Partners have played a key role in organizing Midaynta's previous six conferences. Their expertise ensures each event is meaningful and impactful. For instance, ministries contributed to youth and family wellbeing agendas, academic partners provided evidencebased research, international organizations offered a global perspective, and civil society and law enforcement added practical insights on community safety and trust.

Roundtable Members

- **Government:** Ontario Ministries of Children, Community and Social Services, and Education focus on youth and family wellbeing.
- **International Partners:** UNESCO, UN Security Council, International Organization for Migration, and the U.S. Consulate provide global context.

Proposed Initiative

Youth Resilience Conference – Mogadishu (December 20–21, 2025)

Objective:

- To continue the momentum from the IOM-funded 2024 Youth Resilience Conference by convening a two-day conference in Mogadishu to strengthen Somali youth leadership in peacebuilding, innovation, and resilience.

Participants and Logistics:

- The same 15-member delegation will return to Mogadishu on December 19 to lead and participate in the Youth Resilience Conference.
- The delegation will check out on Monday, December 23, 2025.

Activities:

- Youth-led seminars on leadership, innovation, and peacebuilding.
- Panel discussions with stakeholders, government officials, and civil society partners.
- Launch of a “Youth for Peace” Network to connect youth leaders across Somalia and the diaspora.

Expected Outcome:

- Enhanced youth leadership capacity, stronger networks for collaboration, and alignment with stakeholder’s priorities in promoting durable peace, youth empowerment, and inclusive development.

Partnership and Support Requested

- Midaynta Community Services seeks stakeholders support to implement these two interconnected initiatives. Together, they will advance local peacebuilding efforts, empower young leaders, and strengthen collaboration between Somali communities, the diaspora, and international partners.

Monitoring & Evaluation Plan

Monitoring and Evaluation Plan

To ensure the 7th Annual Youth Resiliency Conference achieves its objectives and contributes to long-term youth resiliency, Midaynta Community Services will implement a comprehensive Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) framework.

Key Activities:

- Pre- and Post-Event Surveys: Measure participant learning outcomes, engagement, and satisfaction.
- Daily Debrief Sessions: Facilitators and participants will review sessions to identify lessons learned and immediate improvements.
- Feedback Forms: Collect insights from youth, elders, partners, and sponsors to capture diverse perspectives.
- Final Evaluation Report: Summarize recommendations, best practices, and actionable next steps for 2026 planning and future initiatives.

Outcome:

This structured M&E approach ensures that the conference:

- Achieves its immediate objectives of empowering youth, fostering dialogue, and promoting peace.
- Provides actionable insights for continuous improvement of programs.
- Strengthens long-term strategies for youth resiliency, and community engagement in Somalia.
